

Constitution of the Republic of Pannonia

The government of the Republic of Pannonia, lead by President Bálint Brunner and assisted by Vice-President Ádám Szatmári, hereby establishes this Constitution, on the 5th February 2012.

Article One - Rights of Citizens

- 1. All citizens of the Republic of Pannonia shall have full freedom of speech, religion, language, press, assembly, movement, and petition to the Présidynçe de Pannonie.
- 2. All citizens of the Republic of Pannonia shall obey the law of the macronations in which Pannonian-claimed territories are located in. This Constitution serves as an extension of the law of either the United Kingdom, Hungary or the Hellenic Republic, depending on where the particular Pannonian-claimed territory which a citizen represents (according to the 'Resolution of Regional Representation' of January 2012) is located.
- 3. All citizens should rely on the law of the macronation they are citizens or residents of with regards to census, crime, personal identity etc.
- 4. Any rights not specifically stated in this Constitution shall be protected.
- 5. All powers not reserved for the Présidynçe de Pannonie shall be delegated to the citizens.

Article Two - Executives

- 1. The Republic of Pannonia shall be run by an elected President.
- 2. The President shall serve until resignation or death.
- 3. The President may, with the consent of other members of the Présidynçe de Pannonie, create new ministries and governmental organisations that shall be the deciding entity in all decisions.
- 4. The President must appoint a Vice-President that will assist him or her, and succeed him or her to the Présidynçe de Pannonie upon their resignation or death.
- 5. The Vice-President will serve as the President's chief advisor.
- 6. The Vice-President has limited governmental power while in office and requires the President's permission to legally modify or publicly introduce any governmental decision.

- 7. The Vice-President is required to be a personal acquaintance of the President.
- 8. The Vice-President may appoint, with approval of the President and other members of the Présidynçe de Pannonie, a successor to their office.

Article Three - Amending

- 1. The President may introduce an amendment that requires a majority of members of the Présidynçe de Pannonie to ratify it.
- 2. The citizens of the Republic of Pannonia may introduce an amendment that requires a majority of citizens (including both virtually registered and active territorial citizens) to pass it to the President and other members of the Présidynçe de Pannonie who can decide whether it can be passed.
