WHAT IS THE REPUBLIC OF PANNONIA? WHAT DO I HAVE TO KNOW ABOUT IT?

The Republic of Pannonia is a micronation founded on 11 November 2011 by Bálint Brunner, current president. It is located primarily in the United Kingdom and Hungary with some territories in Greece.

In a nutshell

Pannonia is a statecraft project aiming to establish and maintain a territorial presidential republic. Although the state had previously been non-territorial, it is now claiming small, unused pieces of land in European macronations.


Citizenship can be acquired on its website for free. The republic issues passports, secondary license plates and international ovals in the form of printable documents to all official citizens.

The territory of Pannonia is divided into nine 'provinces', four of which are in the United Kingdom, four in Hungary and one, the largest, in Greece. The General Panno-

nian Time Zone (UTC) is used in all provinces. Pannonia's currency, the florin is pegged to the value of 1 Swiss Franc.

Pannonians may also be proud of their wonderful culture, which involves aspects, such as national cuisine, family traditions and the Pannonian French language.

The latter is Pannonia's main official language, used for everyday communication. It differs from original French only in writing, as it uses a slightly modified orthography. English and Hungarian are also considered official by the government, which is called 'Présidyņçe de Pannonie'.



THE GOVERNMENT

The Pannonian government is often referred to as 'Présidyņçe de Pannonie' (Presidency of Pannonia) and is currently lead by president Brunner. The state is governed with the contribution of several other agencies and ministries, such as the MAE (Ministry of Foreign Affairs), the AMP (Pannonian Media Association), the Police Nationale de Pannonie (National Police), the Banque de Pannonie (National Bank), the RTP (Pannonian Registry of Territory) or the Comité Culturel de Pannonie (Cultural Committee).
